Seasiders have had to change venue to the another secondary school in Skegness because of demand and are still recruting through a Facebook campaign and a 'bring a friend' initiative. Recently the club set up friendly matches against other teams in the area to give the girls some competition and a chance to try out the skills they learnt over the first part of the year.
